

- The Forum will proactively engage with a broad and diverse range of consumer representatives and service-users, and put their views at the beginning of the strategy setting process.




The role of the PSR


The role of the PSOCG






- Establishment of Forum announced in PSR March 2015 Policy Statement



- Forum agreed final list of detriments at its 2nd Meeting on 15 December 2015
- Detriments allocated to most appropriate Working Groups responsible for: grouping, prioritising, assessing, identifying solutions and developing implementation plans
